The senior eight continued down to the bridge, where for the last half-mile the stroke was raised to thirty for a spurt. The return was made in easy stretches. Among the visitors at quarters to-day was Capt. Cutler of the Harvard 'Varsity eight, who talked over matters with Capt. Frost of the Yale 'Varsity.
